

I have wanted to start publishing my family history research for a long time. I really like the idea of picture books but wanted to have more creative control than the big websites offer. I found this book and love it. The book walks you through how to organize your information, digitizing your documents and photos, and outlining your story. It also tells you how create your own scrapbook page by adding photos and text and using digital templates and embellishments. This book was easy to follow and get started on my own project. I have made several digital scrapbook pages and refer

back to sections of the book as needed. I would recommend this book to any family historian who wants to tell their ancestor's story!

The scrapbook approach will make it much easier to expand to a family history book later. The fear factor sets in when considering a full fledged book, but scrapbooking is fun. For me, this book was a good investment. I heartily recommend it.

I have been a genealogist for over thirty years and have been doing scrapbooks for over twenty. I have just started to work on some family heritage albums and have been procrastinating because there are so many choices. This book provided just enough information to help me focus and simplify the process. The author is very good at helping you narrow down by persons or topics and walks you through each step. Very quick how to do book. I would recommend it!

If you are a veteran digital scrapper you have the skills to bypass this book. If you are a beginner, it gives good information on how to compose a page. If you are wanting a book to help you determine what is important to include in a digital heritage book, there are good tips for selection and refining of selections to make a cost effective book. I personally wished there had been more technical information. Though I have created digital scrapbooks, I need more skills to do them justice.

This book has a lot to offer. It takes the reader step by step through the process of creating a heritage digital scrapbook. I appreciated the ideas of what to include and where to find more on family members.
